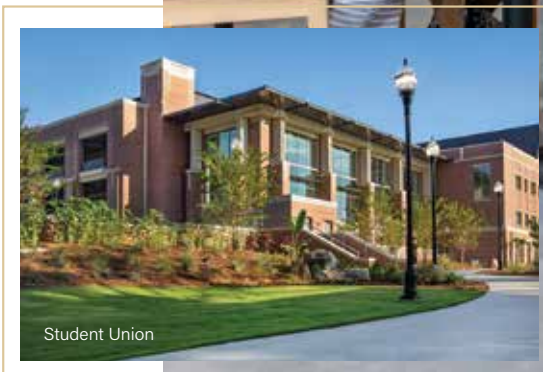
We have suite and apartment-style residence halls. The hall you are assigned to determines the style and layout of your room.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Admitted students are automatically considered for merit-based scholarships, regardless of financial circumstances. A separate application is not required. Scholarships are limited, so students should apply for admission by December 1.
